

Summary of Access and Participation Plan 2025-26 to 2028-29

What is an access and participation plan?

An access and participation plan describes what a university intends to do to support disadvantaged and underrepresented groups. It covers getting into university (access), staying at university (continuation), doing well in your studies (success), graduating at the end of a course (completion) and getting a good job after you leave (progression).

Key points

We aim to support disadvantaged and underrepresented groups by embedding inclusive practices in all our activities.

- We are committed to attracting more students from backgrounds that are under-represented in higher education.
- We are committed to supporting those students to do well at Bath Spa University and with our <u>delivery partners</u>.
- We are committed to providing bursaries and other forms of financial assistance to support those students.

What are we aiming to achieve?

We are working collectively as a community to embed equity at the heart of Bath Spa and ensure that everyone has access to the same opportunities; no matter their background.

To guide our progress, we have a Widening Participation Strategy which further describes our principles.

What are we doing to address risks to equality of opportunity?

Bath Spa University promotes **equality of opportunity.** This means that students from all backgrounds are supported to access, succeed and progress in higher education. We have developed six areas where we will work towards eliminating the challenges facing disadvantaged and underrepresented groups of students.



The strategies are designed to work together. This connected approach allows us to target activities for underrepresented groups in specific locations and to address our objectives.

How will students be involved in our plan?

We will continue to work with students both through co-creation and evaluation of activities. We will achieve this through student representation on university committees, continual student engagement and feedback, and a Student Panel co-delivered with our <u>Students' Union</u>.

Evaluation - how will we measure what we have achieved?

- We will continue to invest in staff development and training in evaluation
- We will involve students and graduate research assistants in the planning, monitoring, evaluation and delivery of access and participation work.
- We will support evaluation activity within our partner providers.
- We will publish our evaluation outcomes both within the University and externally.

Fees we charge

Financial help available

Priority group awards	Independent Bursary (for care leavers/foyer students)

Access Funds	Undergraduate students in temporary financial difficulty
Accommodation Bursary	Home undergraduate students with a household income of up to $\pounds 20,000$
Laptop Fund	Home undergraduate students with Student Finance Funding, studying at Newton Park, Sion Hill, Locksbrook, Corsham Court or BSU London (Hoxton)
Global Horizons Award (Outward Mobility) Fund	Home undergraduate students with a household income of up to \pounds 42,875, embarking on an international placement of at least 10 days
Professional Placement Bursary	All home undergraduate students on a Professional Placement Year (Bath only)
