- To extend our curriculum and skills portfolio through more diverse and flexible pathways and careers and employability experiences and opportunities that meet the needs of different learners throughout their learning journeys
- To embed social inclusion and social mobility in our curriculum, pedagogy and quality and standards so as to foster and develop the curiosity, confidence and creativity of our students
- To improve student success and outcomes by enhancing the student journey and experience and beyond through evidence led interventions and by taking a whole institutional approach
